At MED we have three types of posts; elected posts that form the executive committee, appointed members and country liaisons. Elections take place each year via the main Academy of Management election system. If you are interested in standing for any position, please contact the Division Chair, Alvin Hwang, to indicate your interest. Another good way of making your interest known is at the annual meeting. Please come along to any of our events, especially the social. The country liaison roles are our representatives in each territory. They operate in many different ways, but the main one is as a point of contact. If you want to find out more about MED, contacting a local country liaison is a great way to do it.

Similar to other divisions, we operate with a five-year cycle of leadership jobs:

- 1st Year: PDW Chair (Program Chair-Elect)
- 2nd Year: Program Chair
- 3rd Year: Division Chair-Elect

Each year we elect the person who starts the cycle, i.e. we elect a PDW Chair every year.

Country Liaison "Best Practices"

A couple of years ago, we captured the following suggestions to help country liaisons maximise their impact:

1. Forward via email calls for papers for annual meetings to members of your department, faculty, and other campuses in your country.
2. Ensure that details of the AOM conference and the MED program are included newsletters of your country's professional organization.
3. Encourage colleagues to submit their papers to the Academy meetings, occasionally helping out with language skills, explaining the difference between a competitive paper, symposium, a PDW, a caucus, etc.
4. Answering questions to the best of your ability with respect to "navigating the academy meetings" and pointing them to the orientation meetings that some divisions hold (including hints about where to get free food, ice cream or coffee, etc!).
5. Add a line at the end of your e-signature to "advertise" the division/meeting.
6. Attend the meetings for your peers (fellow liaisons or representatives to whatever organization) so that your country is represented.
7. Introduce people that ask about collecting data in your country to each other, either in person or electronically.
8. Make information on innovative MED-related research projects conducted in your country available via the MED newsletter (submit information to the MED newsletter editor Darlene Alexander-Houle)
9. Make the MED community aware of journals published in your country that welcome manuscripts on MED-related topics.
10. Talk to doctoral students at your school or other schools from your country about opportunities with MED.
